#### **Proposed Measurable Outcomes:**

- 1) Provide a purpose/use of vacant city land by providing a designated space for non-traditional park users who are not looking for playgrounds or sports but want a quiet place to sit and reflect.
- 2) Provide a memorial that honors our local veterans for their service and provides a destination for others to visit and remember their contributions.
- 3) Increase use of the adjacent trail by providing a connecting destination for trail users to visit, rest, and reflect, and a place for those from outside of our community to learn more about local veterans.


### **Plan for Evaluating Results:**

- 1) Collect data about usage with regular park and trail user surveys.
- 2) Track attendance at specific events held at the park, such as veterans' programs.
- 3) Solicit feedback from local veterans' organizations on how the project has impacted them and their members.

### Actual Measured Outcomes and Evaluation: Outcomes data not yet available.

- 1) The city has not yet conducted user surveys.
- 2) A park dedication event was conducted on Veterans Day, November 11, 2023, where a dedication ceremony was sponsored by the American Legion. Legion Commander Lashinski and Mayor Lawrence Wheeler gave remarks. Members of the American Legion, Sons of the American Legion, and several residents were in attendance.
- 3) The city has not yet received feedback from our local veterans' organizations, though it has been requested.
