#### Evaluation outcomes from the grant application.- Results:

THE FIRST TWO EVALUATION QUESTION RESULTS COME FROM THE PHOTOGRAPHERS AND WRITERS 1. Did you enjoy creating this book? Why?

OUTCOME: Local photographers and writers will experience the joys of creating a children's book.

- It was an involvement that I would never been involved with felt like I learned a bit of the process of producing a book. Much more work than I figured, my part was probably the easiest.
- I definitely enjoyed helping create this book. It was a neat experience to get to really observe Watonwan County in a different view, than you normally do on a day to day basis. As a photographer, you try to find the beauty in normal things, so with this book not only did I get to exercise this, but I liked seeing that the other photographers got to do this as well ..... maybe something they don't normally do.

I was especially pleased in seeing the very positive response of the residents of each community as we visited them in their own public libraries, answering questions and making comments about how the book was made. They were excited to receive a book and for all of us, it was a rewarding experience.

2. Did you learn more about the process of photographing for a book, writing a book, or creating a book? If so, what was the most interesting thing to you about the process?

  fun to see what the writers had written about our photo. As a photographer, I have usually thought

that the quality of my works is based off of my own creativity, but with this book it was a group process and helped me see creativity in a different way.

This project gave me the opportunity to do something that I never would have considered doing on my own or in a group, especially at this time in my life. I am glad I responded to the "ad" and was accepted as a participant. I grew from this experience. My thanks to Stacy Lienemann and Wilma Wolner for their role in making this project happen.
- The most interesting thing to me was the process of "intentional" photography...most of my photographic experience has not involved "staging" photos or looking for specific subjects.
- Most of my writing is for adults, so writing in this project has made me see my community through
  the eyes of a younger person, and in turn, this new perspective gave me a greater appreciation and
  excitement towards membership in my community.
