10. Actual measured outcomes and evaluation of the project as required under <u>129D.17</u>, <u>subdivision 2</u>:

The Women Veteran Memorial has been deemed a success and facilitated myriad conversations on the rich history Minnesota women Veterans continue to play in serving our state. Qualitatively, these community conversations have contributed to a greater awareness of women Veterans roles in serving not only the state but also the nation through their accomplishments around the globe. Presently, the two 10' foot tall silhouettes are positioned on main street in Ramsey's downtown that sees more than 5,000 vehicles per day along that 30 mph street. Additionally, many hundreds of people pass by the monument on the sidewalk each week on their way to do business at the Ramsey Municipal Center and Anoka County Driver's Services offices.

The Women Veterans Memorial debuted at Elmcrest Park's annual Art Fair in the Spring of 2023 with almost 1,000 attendees at the day-long event. From a quantitative perspective, 100's of people engaged with the silhouettes at the booth there (image below) and the Foundation membership staffing it. Artist and Iraq Veteran SSG Mary Horgan was present the entire day and interacted with the public on the background on the project, and the funding which included mention of the Arts and Cultural Heritage Fund. Mary Horgan's 'talking points' also included the following cultural context (text provided by Mary);

'From the battlefields of the American Revolution to the deserts of Kuwait and on, Minnesota Women have been serving in the military, in one form or another, for more than 200 years. They have had to overcome decades of obstacles to get to where they are today: serving in greater numbers, in combat roles, support roles and in leadership positions all around the world. This memorial acknowledges the long history of Minnesota Women serving in the military – it celebrates the many achievements and tasks they have performed. Of the hundreds of different duty positions, the memorial depicts a woman soldier in combat and a woman pilot. Women have proudly served in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, and Merchant Marines. They have served on Active duty, as State Reserve and Guard duty, and activated from the Reserve and National Guard. Indeed they have faced unending and unjust obstacles in their path, yet, they courageously forged forward. In doing so they led the way for future women serving, and hopefully have left a smoother path to success.

There were, and unfortunately still are, times when these Warriors are forgotten, or, not visible in our community. It is the goal of this memorial to remind us all of these brave Minnesota women, whether serving now, or as Veterans having served. These women stood up and swore to protect our state and nation, and they followed through with this promise. They should be recognized for their brave and selfless act.'

This project honors Minnesota women veterans. It provides a place for the community to remember those who have served in the military and support those that are still serving.

The silhouettes are intended to be moved around the City of Ramsey to various city parks and other locations. In June 2023, the silhouettes were placed at Elmcrest Park and are now place at Ramsey Municipal Center.
