#### Subcommittee Chair Role:

The chair of a subcommittee works with Legacy staff & Liaisons to schedule meetings outside of the PTLAC's meetings (if needed). The subcommittee chair also works with staff to keep track of the group's work plan progress. Any willing, interested members can volunteer to be a chair of a subcommittee.

#### Subcommittee Member Role:

Members work with the subcommittee chair & Legacy staff to provide feedback on work items, and volunteer their time and resources as they are available to do so. PTLAC members choose on which subcommittee they'd like to serve. Members can serve on multiple subcommittees at any given time. There is no limit or cap to the number of members that a subcommittee can hold.
